Technical Talk

With spring just around the corner, the Model "A" will be coming out of winter hibernation. One of the things to do before driving is lubrication - Model "A" Things to Lubricate:

1. Horn (light weight oil only)
2. Hood hook springs (regular weight oil)
3. Hood hinges (spray type oil)
4. Door hinges (spray type oil)
5. Door latch parts (spray type oil)
6. Accelerator cross shaft bearings (regular oil)
7. Accelerator linkage ends (regular oil)
8. Carburetor shafts (regular oil)
9. Distributor linkage ends (regular oil)
10. Brake rod ends (clean with spray brake cleaner; then oil with 600W oil)
11. Front and rear leaf springs (spray type oil)
12. Trunnion on clutch (600W oil)
13. Clutch release arm shaft (regular oil where production grease fittings are absent)
14. Clutch trunnion rod clevis pins (600W oil)
15. Clutch and brake pedal shaft bushings (regular oil where production grease fittings are absent)
16. Brake cross shaft bushings (regular oil)
17. Brake pedal to cross shaft clevis pins (600W oil)
18. Emergency brake clevis pins (600W oil)
19. Emergency brake cross shaft bushings on 1930-31 small shaft (600W oil where production grease fittings are absent)
20. Emergency brake shafts in backing plate (regular oil)
21. Whenever brake drums are off, oil emergency brake shaft on inside of backing plate
22. Whenever front or rear brake drums are off, wash everything with brake cleaner then wipe all moving mechanical parts with white lithium grease
23. Spray levers inside car (light film of Vaseline)
24. Upper steering column bushing (regular oil)
25. Windshield wiper (regular oil for electrics, pneumatic oil for vacuum types)

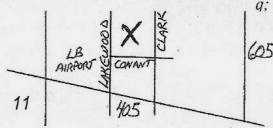

1930s FASHION

Accessories
A woman wore gloves for both day and evening. Day gloves gathered loosely at the cuff. Evening gloves were long open a length. A simple handbag, small angular hat and shoes always matched.

Jewelry
Simple art deco designs of small plain pearls were all the jewelry a woman needed. Earrings and bracelets were preferred over flashy necklaces and pins.

Evening Gowns
Elegant bias cut floor length gowns with sweeping flared hems was the style of the decade. Modest necklines on the front opened up to bare backs. Black, pastels and jewel tones in silk, satin or lace.

Day Dresses
Floral prints, polka dots and muted colors fitted a daytime wardrobe. Dresses had modest tops, wide sleeves or cape effect and a slender bias cut body with flare at the hem. Length ranged from floor to slightly below the knee. Matching thin belt at the high waist.

Shoes
Shoes had thick heels and full coverage but with ankle straps, cutouts and perforations. Two tone heels were very common as well as mixing textures. Oxfords were a daytime comfort shoe.

Formal shoes were tall pumps and strappy sandals in gold, silver and jewel tones.

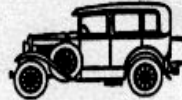

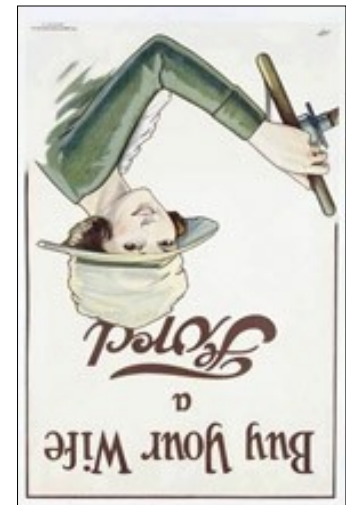

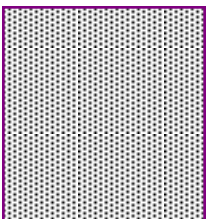
