Some Hubley Race Car info

Hi Dick .

I have a little something you might want to use in the next newsletter.

August 27 is our club picnic and with that comes our Hubley races! So now is a good time to either build one or service the one you have.

The rules for the Hubley race are as follows:

Models must be either a Hubley kit, a Gabriel kit or a Scale Model kit. The model may or may not be painted. No modifications to the wheel, hub or axle. It must use the original wheel, hub and axle screw. Steering may be fixed or moveable. A DRY lubricant may be used on the wheels ... NO OIL of any kind!! Weight of the car cannot be over 21oz (Bobby D will have a scale to check your car). Any added weight should be secure and not loose

Bobby D has come up with a different idea for choosing who goes against who and will explain it at the picnic.

Technical Talk

What is this stuff called Loctite?

Thread locker, thread glue, Loctite...a rose by any other name...

Nearly all of the critical fasteners on the Model A use a castle nut with cotter pin. This is probably why they have lasted so long. Modern cars rely on lock washers and often a bit of Loctite.

The two most common types are the blue (medium strength) and red (high strength).

Most applications only require medium strength so blue is what you will see in most tool boxes. It separates with regular tools.

Red is high strength and may require heating things up with a torch to weaken the bond.

What about the green stuff? Well this is not thread lock. It is for press fit items without threads such as valve stem seals and guides or press in grease fittings. With wear the interference fit may not be enough to hold things, so the green stuff can fill in a couple thousands of a gap to hold the press fit item tight.



MAFFI Newsletter Minute-July 2022






