A Note from Harbor President Rob Hernandez



Happy New Year! If you haven't already renewed your membership and gotten tickets for the annual banquet, get on the throttle. Several fun events are in the planning stages so if you have a fun place to visit, please share your ideas on the place, drive, or restaurant to visit so the club can check it out.

I drove the car in two parades recently, my first parade events. It was a lot of fun. Some of the other club members are much more creative than me in decorating their cars. It may not seem like much, but talking with a few folks afterwards I received the feedback on how much folks like to see the old cars in the parades. If you haven't done one recently, I encourage you to sign up for the next one.


I guess we don't have to worry about being too hot in our cars this time of year. However, there are other things such as rain and it getting dark early in the evening that may require some extra preparation for the drive. Margarita doesn't have a working windshield wiper. This hasn't been an issue as I carry a small squeegee to clear the mist and rain clears itself like on a motorcycle visor. There are several water treatments for glass to help bead and clear your windshield such as RainX and AquaShield. Clean glass with a fresh coating gets the job done.

I tried several times but failed to align my headlights correctly shining them against a building. The lights were so bad that I installed LED driving lights below the bumper to see at night. Fortunately, I found an alignment procedure using levels which worked great! Use a 4-foot level (or straight edge) to get both headlights pointed in the same direction (parallel), then use a small level to tilt them down $\frac{1}{2}$ bubble. 32 candle power never looked so bright! If you have bright LED bulbs, correct alignment avoids blinding other drivers since the light is focused on the road and not into the cab.

Stay safe and I hope to see you at the next meeting or on the road.

anniversary picnic with some wonderful food (of course), and some great friendships. We also have to pause to remember those loved


ones that passed. We miss them. . . .






