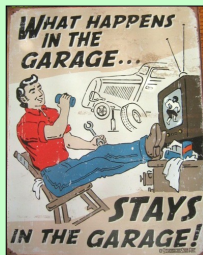

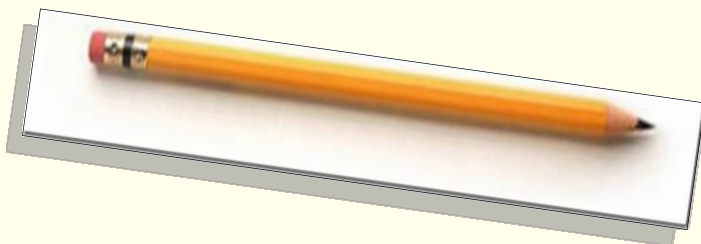

Historian's article

Back in 1981, the Harbor Area Model A Club was chosen to host the National Model A Restorers Club's West Coast Judging School. This was a great honor, since the Schools were always held in the Eastern region. On April 25, 1981, the School was held at the Holiday Inn in Torrance (now the Doubletree by Hilton).

According to the May 1981 Harbor Light, there were about 70 attendees. They came from far and wide, including Ontario, Canada, and many western states.

Training was offered in two judging areas: Electrical (Area 2) and Upholstery (Area 12). An experienced judge, Jerry Wilhelm, spoke for three hours on the Model A's electrical system, and another, Bill Sturm from Wisconsin presented information on Model A upholstery for another four. It's safe to say that after all that time, attendees would certainly have been well informed, and if they wanted to be, certified judges in those two areas.

It appears that the trainings are no longer offered at Schools. They are handled remotely, with three steps: 1) Obtain judging standards books and corresponding tests [such as Electrical/Area 2 and Upholstery (Area 12) above.] 2) Take "open book" tests in those area(s), and send them to National for grading. A score of 80 or greater is considered passing. 3) Volunteer for a regional, divisional, or national meet as an apprentice to experienced judges. Once all of these requirements are fulfilled, the Judgeship is conferred. With further experience, positions as a Senior Judge, or a Master Judge are available.

Tech Tips

Jim's Tech Tips

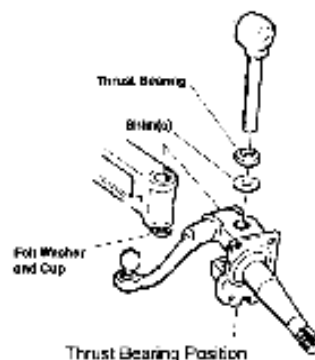
"Difficult Steering"

Many Model A owners find their car hard to steer when parking or maneuvering at low speed. After you confirm that there is oil in the steering gear box (not grease), the tires are all inflated to 35 psi, and everything on the front axle has been properly greased, you are left with the most likely cause: The spindle bolt (kingpin) "thrust bearings" are defective or they are not shimmed up properly to support the weight of the car. You can confirm this by using a floor jack to take some weight off of the front wheels, and then see if the steering effort is drastically reduced. If it is, the problem is the bearings.

To correct this, you need to remove everything from the spindles to get to the kingpins and remove them. See Les Andrews' Red Book, starting on page 1-209, for directions. The illustration below comes from later in that section.

Clean the thrust bearing and replace it if it does not turn smoothly or shows any signs of wear. Pack the bearing with grease before reinstalling.

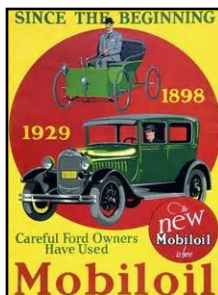
When reassembling, you need to test fit the spindle with the kingpin fully locked in place with the locking pin. Temporarily leave the large felt seal and metal washer off of the bottom of the spindle for this. Start with the number of shims previously used, then add 1 shim at a time until very little or no vertical movement of the spindle is felt on the kingpin. It can take up to 4 shims to compensate for wear.



At some point, adding a shim may jam up the spindle, making it hard to turn on the kingpin. If it does, take that last shim out, reassemble, and confirm that the spindle again moves easily, as it should. Now reassemble the spindle on the axle with the felt seal and the cupped metal washer installed between the axle and the bottom part of the spindle (the metal cup touches the axle, the felt touches the spindle). The added thickness of the felt seal may temporarily make the spindle a bit stiff turning on the kingpin, but it will quickly flatten out and move smoothly when you drive.

Now reinstall everything that attaches to the spindle, install the brakes, maybe use this as an opportunity to clean and repack the wheel bearings, then install the drums and the wheels. Grease all of the fittings well. Go for a test drive, enjoy the easier steering, and *Have a Model A Day!*



Steering Post Starter

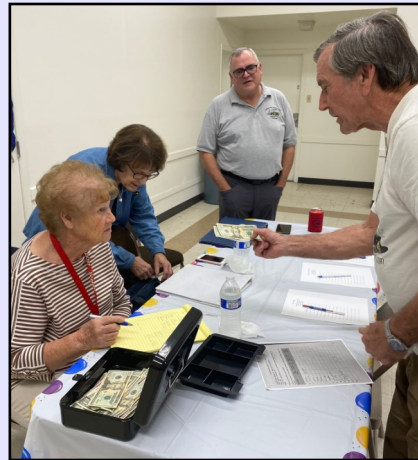
