

## Hey Model A'ers,

"You really missed it," if you didn't come to the November 17<sup>th</sup> road trip to the **San Antonio Winery**! This was probably my favorite outing I have done with the Club.

Even if you never drink wine you missed a very interesting tour of the winery and the processes and procedures they go through to create and make the wine from grape juice.

Personally, I missed the drive down in my Model A, because of a faulty starter, but Dennis created a very detailed map to make it there off of the freeway. I was told he drove down there in his modern several times to get the route exactly right to keep the cars running in their natural environment. But even though I missed the drive I enjoyed the fact that the Winery had roped off parking to show our cars proudly right by the front door.

The San Antonio Winery has gone through several restorations since its opening in 1917 on Lamar Street in East Los Angeles. It was family built and still run by the descendants of Santo Cambianica Family. The property is beautifully restored and everything to process the wine is done on the property. The grapes used in the wine making are mostly from Paso Robles and shipped down for processing and bottling.

Our tour guide had worked in the winery for 45 years and is the oldest employee of the winery, I think he said he started when he was 16, so you could ask him anything about the wine and processing and he would know the answer with knowledge and expertise.

We took the Winery Tour then had a great lunch inside the winery restaurant (the obvious club thing to do). After the great lunch, a good portion of the club saddled up to the wine bar for tastings and purchasing wine. I know I spent way too much but the wine is very good and really not what you would expect from East LA.




#### Jim's Tech Tips "Difficult Steering"

Many Model A owners find their car hard to steer when parking or maneuvering at low speed. After you confirm that there is oil in the steering gear box (not grease), the tires are all inflated to 35 psi, and everything on the front axle has been properly greased, you are left with the most likely cause: The spindle bolt (kingpin) "thrust bearings" are defective or they are not shimmed up properly to support the weight of the car. You can confirm this by using a floor jack to take some weight off of the front wheels, and then see if the steering effort is drastically reduced. If it is, the problem is the bearings.

To correct this, you need to remove everything from the spindles to get to the kingpins and remove them. See Les Andrews' Red Book, starting on page 1-209, for directions. The illustration below comes from later in that section.

Clean the thrust bearing and replace it if it does not turn smoothly or shows any signs of wear. Pack the bearing with grease before reinstalling.

When reassembling, you need to test fit the spindle with the kingpin fully locked in place with the locking pin. Temporarily leave the large felt seal and metal washer off of the bottom of the spindle for this. Start with the number of shims previously used, then add 1 shim at a time until very little or no vertical movement of the spindle is felt on the kingpin. It can take up to 4 shims to compensate for wear.



At some point, adding a shim may jam up the spindle, making it hard to turn on the kingpin. If it does, take that last shim out, reassemble, and confirm that the spindle again moves easily, as it should. Now reassemble the spindle on the axle with the felt seal and the cupped metal washer installed between the axle and the bottom part of the spindle (the metal cup touches the axle, the felt touches the spindle). The added thickness of the felt seal may temporarily make the spindle a bit stiff turning on the kingpin, but it will quickly flatten out and move smoothly when you drive.

Now reinstall everything that attaches to the spindle, install the brakes, maybe use this as an opportunity to clean and repack the wheel bearings, then install the drums and the wheels. Grease all of the fittings well. Go for a test drive, enjoy the easier steering, and *Have a Model A Day!*




