Saturday Morning Coffee Gathering is Alive and Well!



AN UNEXPECTED DELIGHT

Union Station - Saturday, July 12, 2025.

I always enjoy our tours and getting together with such a great group of people. But this one turned out to be a bit of a surprise. We met at the agreed upon time, not too early. Caravanning, staying together on the freeway as best we could, we met up with the Docent for our tour of Union Stations Art and Architecture.

Even though I have been there many, many times through the years I was seeing it through different eyes. We started at the fish tank in the Metro area near the back of the building. They gave us these amazing sound amplifiers to wear, and the docent had a microphone, so that, when she spoke, it was as if she was speaking right into our ears. I always expected to turn and see her beside me and she was not. When you walk by the fish tank it is just a regular tank with some amazing fish, but then she pointed out the etching in the glass and told us the different stories represented. We heard about the history of the location and what was found there when they began to clear the land for the building. There is a setting across from the fish tank that represents much of the history and includes some of the items that had been found. The setting looks like a small stream with mounds that represent the mountains and contain many of the artifacts and items from the initial dig.

I will only mention some of the highlights of our tour, but know there was much more. We learned about the patterns that were used and what they represented, a mural that had some of the architect's family members, and the meaning behind the ones chosen. Be sure to ask us about the Bill Bell interactive exhibit titled "A Train" you start the interaction by saying 'Hey Bill, old buddy "

Next we entered the waiting area, where you experienced the absence of loud noise and she pointed out the acoustics that were part of the original design and environment in that area. As I said, there is much more, but I will only tell you about one more thing: an area that is generally closed to the public, but we had a private viewing. It was the Fred Harvey restaurant and The Streamliner sidebar that resembled an elegant speakeasy of the time. They were setting up for a private wedding but allowed us the opportunity to view the interior spaces. There were stories about the Harvey Girls and their role in train travel during WWII. The tour was full of information and was enjoyed by our group!

And, finally, as per our usual, we ended our trip eating together at Phillipe the Original. We had delicious French dip sandwiches (Which they are famous for) with all of the traditional sides you could think of, including pickled eggs and pickled pigs feet. It was a fun day, and I enjoyed getting acquainted with some of our newer members. Hope you can join us next time on some of our upcoming adventures.

Jim's Tech Tips

Headlamp Plugs and Terminals

As documented in the Ford Service Bulletins, below, a change was made to the headlamp plugs and terminals around May 1930. It is a small change in the wire connector ends and the "plug" lengths used with them. If your wiring harness ends and headlamp plugs are from different times, the connection at the base of your headlights may be too tight to connect (frustrating) or too loose to make a good connection (frustrating, as well). See discussion below and adjust the plug dimension as required.



CHANGE IN HEADLAMP PLUGS AND TERMINALS

A change has been made in the headlamp

plugs and the headlamp wire terminals.

The new plug A-14584-D is approximately 9/16" long and is made from red rubber.

The old plug, which has been obsoleted, was 5%" long and was made from black rubber.

The new headlamp wire terminals are of the light of the red rubber.

clinch-on type. They are approximately 1/16" longer than the old design which has been obsoleted (see Fig. 908).

As special equipment is required to assemble the new design terminals to the headlamp wires, the terminals will not be sold through service. If an occasion should arise where it was necessary to replace one of the new terminals, use terminal A-14461-C for making the replacement; this terminal can be in stalled by hand. Also after present stocks of the old design A-14459 terminals are exhausted, supply terminal A-14461-C for replacements. Fig. 909 shows these terminals.

Due to the difference in the length of the old and new style terminals and headlamp plugs, the old style plugs cannot be used with the new design terminals, or the old terminals with the new plug.

After present stocks are exhausted, when calls are received for an old style plug, supply the new design plug, together with spacer washer A-14601-R. This spacer washer is

approximately it " thick and compensates for the difference in length between the old and new style plugs. Fig. 910 shows how the washer is installed.



So, when you are assembling your headlights and the conduits do not want to make a good connection at the base, check the dimensions above and get plugs to match.






