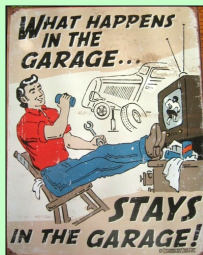

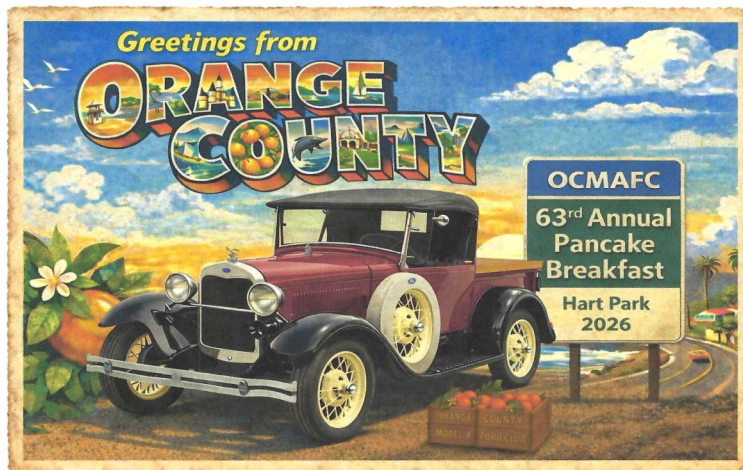

OUR MAGICAL MYSTERY TOUR

On February 28th, a particularly lovely day weather-wise, more than 20 daring Harbor Area Model A Club members embarked on a Mystery Tour that turned out to be quite delightful and gave us a great opportunity to put some “smileage” on our cars. It worked out really well that we were able to park once and walk to all the stops on the tour. We headed from Spires to San Pedro where we first enjoyed a fabulous lunch at Raffaello Ristorante. In case you couldn’t guess, we had wonderful Italian cuisine with generous portions.

Following lunch, we walked less than two blocks to our second stop, a visit to see the extensive and varied collection of George Woytovich and Patti Kraakevic. Housed in a three-story Art Deco building that started life as a Montgomery Ward store, the collection includes so many different things that words can hardly do it justice. We started with seeing George’s fine cars, including an Aston Martin, a Bentley, and a Pantera, which were something Jim H. appreciated. Some of the highlights include movie memorabilia, including cameras, lights, projectors, posters and books; a cabaret theater that features a bar with a brass “fence” from a bank in Portugal; a gallery of George’s photography from their travels in India which Donniss found touched her heart; lots of neon signs (a favorite of Janet), and turnstiles from Candlestick Park. One area that several people noted as especially fun was the hallway that is filled with a Pullman car lounge with the scenery one would see on a train ride from Chicago to Los Angeles projected on the walls outside the windows. George shot the scenery himself when he and Patti took that train trip. Their home on the third floor contains numerous incredible items such as a serving cart from the Queen Mary, two bumper cars (one from Pacific Ocean Park), and a rare Wurlitzer jukebox that was only made for a short time because, shortly after production of this particular model began, they figured out the technology to flip the records over automatically. A magnificent wood-glass-and-brass revolving door serves as the entrance to their bathrooms, closets and dressing areas. The door came from the Westclox factory in Illinois. Access to the 6,000 square foot rooftop garden features a B-52 bomber ladder. The group appreciated George and Patti’s warm and generous hospitality in opening their home and museum to us.

Our last stop was right next door at Collage: A Place for Art and Culture where we saw a show called *Buddy Holly’s Apartment Tapes*. During the two months before his fatal plane crash, Buddy Holly wrote a number of songs which he recorded on demo tapes in his Greenwich Village apartment. J.P. McDermott, an award-winning singer, guitarist, and bandleader, performed these songs and others and explored what in Holly’s life might have led to these songs and how his move to New York City affected the 22-year old from Texas. Folks found that the stories and background that McDermott shared added interest and depth to the musical performance. Several people also noted the importance of Collage’s executive director Richard Foss’s reminder to encourage young people to get out of their cocoons to enjoy the small live theater experience. The show provided a grand finish to our magical Mystery Tour.

We did make one more stop at an art installation facing the parking lot where many of us took pictures with the angel wings painted on the wall. The artist, Colette Miller, created the Global Angel Wings Project in 2012 in the streets of Los Angeles, the City of Angels, and there are now wings in many locations around the world. The wings were painted to remind us that “We are the Angels of this Earth.” Jim H. had the absolute best picture of all.

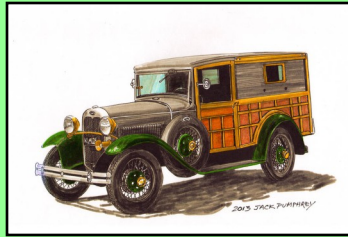

Preventative Maintenance Checklist



MINUTEMAN

EVERY FUEL STOP

Check crankcase oil level
Check radiator water level
Check water pump packing Visual inspection of engine

MONTHLY

Check water pump for leaks and end play
Check carburetor and fuel lines for leaks Inspect fan for cracks
Check battery water level
Check tire air pressure -34 lbs.
Check tires for breaks, cracks, and abnormal wear
Check radiator water level
Check water pump packing Visual inspection of engine

EACH 500 MILES

Lubricate in accordance with 500 mile Lubrication Chart
Change crankcase oil
Tighten accessory mountings (windwings)
Inspect radiator hoses
Check fan belt adjustment (See Service Adjustments)
Check wiper blade rubber
Check generator charging rate, adjust as required (See Service Adjustments)
Check carburetor and fuel lines for leaks.

EACH 1,000 MILES

Do all 500 mile checks
Test front wheel bearings for looseness (See Service Adjustments)
Oil generator bushings at each end of generator
Tighten spring U-bolts, front and rear.
Tighten all wheel lug nuts (64 ft. lbs torque)
Test all lights (head, tail, stop, dash, dome)
Inspect all cotter pins (See cotter pin list)
Wipe out light switch (End of steering column)
Lubricate door hinges, striker plate, dovetails
Inspect entire fuel system for leaks
Inspect exhaust system for leaks
Check steering wheel free play (2" max, See Service Adjustments)
Check specific gravity of battery, charge if needed (See service and repair, Battery)
Check for tight electrical connections at all harness connections.

Check for tight coil connections
Check for tight connections at ammeter and terminal box
Check distributor point gap (.016 -.018) See Service Adjustments
Clean battery posts and clamps, tighten battery ground connection
Clean horn commutator
Drain fuel sediment bowl
Check clutch pedal for free play, See Service Adjustments
Check tail light lens mounting screws

EACH 2,000 MILES

Do all 1,000 mile items
Lubricate in accordance with 2,000 mile Lubrication Chart
Inspect starter commutator and brushes
Examine tires for wear, cracks and damage
Adjust Service Brakes (See service Adjustments)
Inspect front leaf spring for sagging and cracks
Repack top end of shock links
Tighten differential banjo bolts

EACH 5,000 MILES

Do all 2,000 mile items
Test engine compression
Tighten rear wheel axle nut
Rotate tires
Lubricate in accordance with 5000 mile Lubrication Chart
Flush cooling system
Lubricate speedometer cable

EACH 10,000 MILES

Do all 5,000 mile items
Pull all brake drums
Inspect brake linings, drums, and springs
Polish headlight reflectors



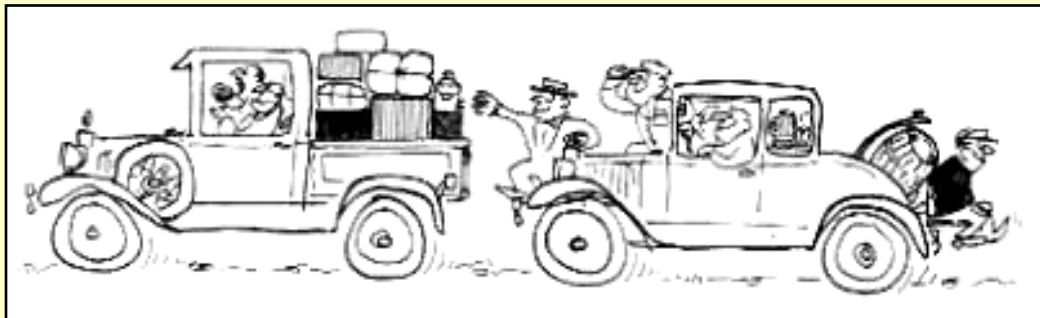

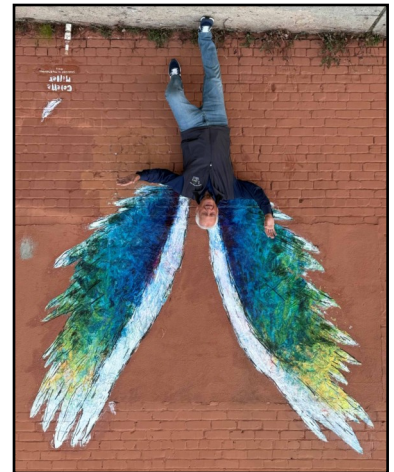
