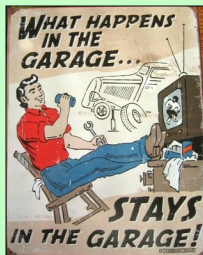

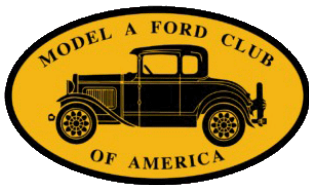

## WHAT A GREAT TRIP!

Harbor A's Return to Solvang

For the first time since 2022, seventeen members and friends of the Harbor A's had an overnight trip to the Central Coast, this time to Lompoc, Solvang and Santa Ynez. To keep the cost of the trip more reasonable, we made this a mid-week trip. Turns out the Santa Ynez Valley was running a promotion for mid-week stays which led to an added bonus for each room we booked – a crisp \$100 bill and a \$20 gift card for Whiskey 'N Rye BBQ!

This was a trip for our modern cars, with some of us caravanning and others setting out on their own. The vast majority of us converged at the La Purisima Mission State Historic Park in Lompoc where we had a brief introduction to the mission provided by one of the park rangers. We spent time in the visitors' center museum, and then visited the many mission buildings which had been built in 1787 and were restored by the Civilian Conservation Corps during the Depression. The visit was a wonderful opportunity to step back in time to the Spanish and Mexican periods of California history.

With our club being known for its serious interest in – you guessed it – food, we returned to one of our favorite Solvang establishments for dinner: Chomp. It was a nice chance to enjoy our meal with great conversation around the table. Upon our return to the hotel (a new one for us, the King Frederik Inn), most of us got down to business with our game night. We had a rousing game of Left-Center-Right which Tim won and a couple of rounds of Bunco which saw Steve win the prizes for last bunco of the night as well as most wins. A really fun time!

The next morning, we started with the continental breakfast provided by the hotel and then got serious with brunch across the street at Brekkies by Chomp. From there, we went the short distance to Santa Ynez where we visited the Santa Ynez Valley Historical Museum and the Parks-Janeway Carriage House. The museum gave us insights into the pioneer period of this area through the extensive collection of historical artifacts and photographs; information on the development of Solvang, beginning in 1911, by a group of Danish Americans seeking to avoid the brutal Midwestern winters; and one of the best carriage collections west of the Mississippi. They also had an amazing exhibit of pen-and-ink and mixed media images by a local artist.

During the afternoon, folks had time to check out the local shops and the farmers' market that was held just down the street from our hotel. We drove to Buellton for dinner at the Hitching Post and returned to the hotel for another exciting game of Left-Center-Right. This time, Gloria came very close to winning, as did Donnis and Steve, but the spoils went to Rose, who joined us as the plus one of new member John Zimmerman and fit right in. The game was followed by a blind taste test of Kringles from three different local bakeries. For those who are interested, the Solvang Bakery and Birkholm Bakery tied overall, with Birkholm having more number 1 ratings.

For our last day, we went to the Santa Ynez Chumash Museum and Cultural Center. This new museum (less than a year old) was fabulous and well worth the 20 years it took from conception to completion. It does an outstanding job of sharing the rich history and vibrant culture of the Chumash people. With this museum, we rounded out our study of the peoples of this area: the indigenous Chumash, the Spanish and Mexicans, and the early pioneers.

You had to know there would be one more meal before we headed for home. This one was quite memorable and was made known to us by Jim Huizdos. Heading from Santa Ynez, past Lake Cachuma along Highway 154, we took a short drive along Stagecoach Road to a hidden gem, Cold Spring Tavern, a historic 1868 stagecoach stop nestled in the San Marcos Pass. What a treat!

All in all, everyone seemed to enjoy our mid-week adventure! Hope to see more of you next time!!

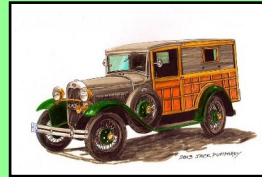

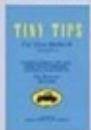
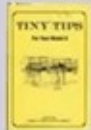
### Tiny Tips

There will be additional specific information to follow.

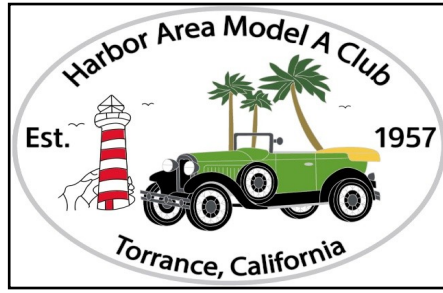
If you are interested, we need the following information from you:

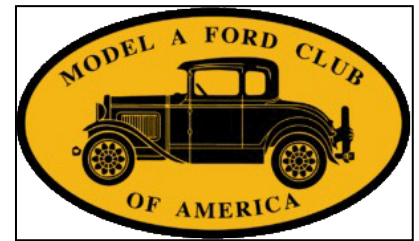
