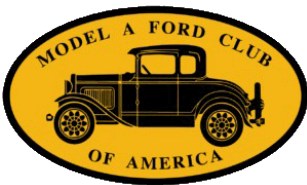

**Saturday**, members headed out on their chosen tours:

1. **Taft Oil Museum:**

An immersive look into the early days of the oil industry and brought to life what an oil camp might have looked like in the early 20th century with a variety of historic structures, including a 1917 era wooden derrick, one of the few originals still standing over its original well. Inside the main building, we saw an impressive collection of exhibits that trace the area’s history from its Native American roots through the oil boom of the early 1900’s, with photos, and actual artifacts (vintage tools, clothing, furniture, area archeological finds like the Sabre Tooth Tiger, etc.) bringing the local stories and history to life. A few members headed out to see the largest bronze statue in California the “Oil Worker Monument” honoring the countless laborers who fueled the California oil boom. Unfortunately, some of those few couldn’t find the intended monument and ended up finding on old pumpjack, one of many, that’s been transformed into a monument, found on streets throughout downtown Taft.

## 2. Tehachapi Loop:

In the 1870's, the Southern Pacific Railroad Company wanted to connect its Central Valley and Southern California lines, which resulted in one of the greatest engineering feats of its time, the Tehachapi Loop.



One of the busiest single-track lines in the US, an average of 50 freight trains traverse this passage daily. Members enjoyed a drive along the loop, stopping at a vista to get the full view of the Tehachapi Loop. They visited Bakersfield National Cemetery where they were greeted by a Native Diamondback Rattlesnake, who sought shelter from the hot sun under one of the Model A's! YIKES!! Continuing on their tour was a stop at Murray Family Farms with lunch and shopping at the Cal Okie Orchard Kitchen, famous for their savory or sweet Okie Pies (an old-fashioned Oklahoma twist to the empanada).

## 3. Hart Park CALM (California Living Museum):

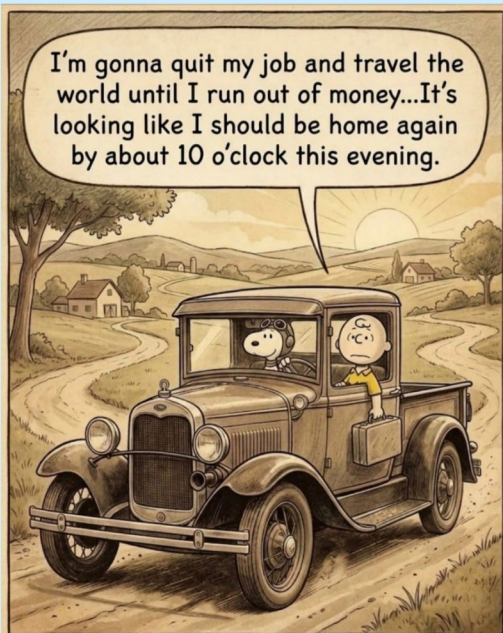

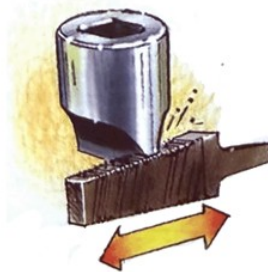
### Tubular Shock Link Removal

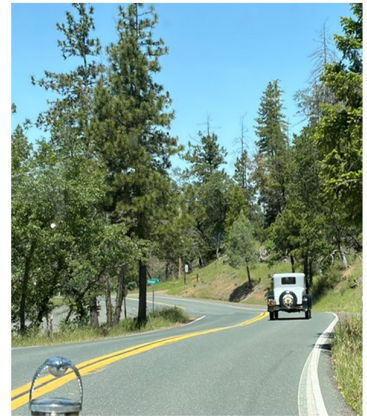
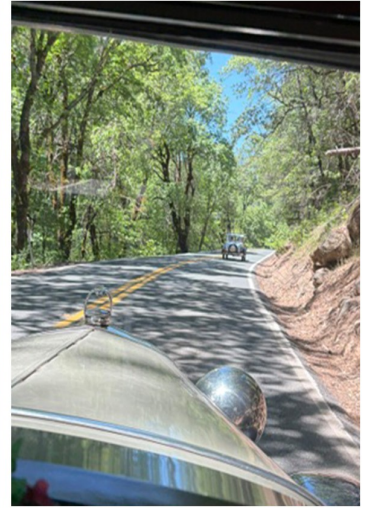

## Technical Talk

### CCRG “Honk Your Horn Seminar”

The first weekend of May, nineteen Harbor Area Members traveled to Bakersfield for the 2026 CCRG Jamboree.

One of the activities that some of us went to was the “Honk Your Horn Seminar.” At the seminar, presented by Dennis Patrick of the Bakersfield Model A’s, we learned everything you wanted to know (and some things you didn’t) about the Klaxon style horn (more commonly known as the Ahooga Horn).

Ahooga Horns are often associated with the Ford Model A, but they were used on many different brands of early automobiles. Because of the distinctive sound, the Ahooga Horn was even utilized as a dive alarm on U.S. submarines during World War II.

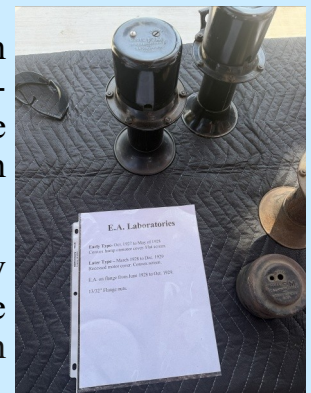
Dennis’s seminar focused mainly on the Model A horns. There were several different manufacturers of Ahooga horns for the Model A. Dennis had an example of each on display for us to see. By far, the most common was the Sparton brand but some of the other brands were AE Laboratories, Ames, Stewart-Warner and G.I.M.

One of the main things that Dennis stressed is the maintenance (or lack of) of the horn to preserve the true sound of your Model A Ahooga Horn. The armature bearings need to be lubricated with a light oil on a regular basis (for example, I oil mine while waiting for the engine oil to drain when doing an oil change), the commutator needs to be cleaned, and the brushes need to be inspected and replaced as needed.

Dennis also explained how to adjust the horn for the best sound.

Lastly, he demonstrated how to rewire shorted field coils, if needed, and, if your car has been converted to 12 volt, how to run your horn on 12 volts, either by installing a dropping resistor or rewind your field coils for 12 volts.

Overall, it was a fantastic seminar and a great learning experience for all who attended.
